**NOTICE following mid-year review of gas transmission tariffs 2024/25 under Condition 2A.2.5.6 of Licence -**

Dear **Licensee / PSA**

This is a notice given under and pursuant to Condition 2A.2.5.6 of **Licensee**, as identified above, for the licence for the conveyance of gas in Northern Ireland (the **Licence**).

Condition 2A.2.5.6 of the Licence is entitled 'Emergency Events' and states as follows:

"If at any point either within the Gas year or in the period from the date of provision of the Forecast Figures for the next Gas Year referred to in Condition 2A.2.3.1 to the start of the next Gas Year an unforeseen event occurs which the Authority believes is likely materially to affect the Forecast Figures for that Gas Year or the next Gas Year the Authority may at its discretion by notice to the Licensee and the **PSA** adjust the Forecast Figures in respect of such Gas Year to reflect the effect of such event. The Forecast Postalised Charges for such Gas Year shall be calculated by the PSA in accordance with such adjusted figures."

Condition 2A.2.5.6 empowers the Utility Regulator to, at its discretion, and by notice to the Licensee and the PSA, adjust the Forecast Figures where an ‘unforeseen event’ occurs within a Gas Year which the Utility Regulator believes is likely to materially affect the Forecast Figures for that Gas Year.

The Utility Regulator considers that an 'unforeseen event' has occurred which is likely materially to affect the Forecast Figures for Gas Year 2024/2025 provided to the PSA by the Licensee in accordance with Condition 2A.2.3.1(f) of the Licence. The 'unforeseen event' that occurred is the damage caused to Ballylumford Power Station by Storm Darragh, has increased actual capacity bookings, resulting in a significant over-recovery in the first five months of the Gas Year and increased forecast capacity bookings in the rest of this Gas Year, with updates for best available forecasts.

The Utility Regulator considers that this ‘unforeseen event’ materially impacts the Forecast Figures provided by Licensee to the UR for Gas Year 2024/2025.

The Utility Regulator has therefore decided to adjust the Forecast Figures for that Gas Year to reflect the effect of this ‘unforeseen event.’

Accordingly, the Utility Regulator hereby gives notice to Licensee / PSA under Condition 2A.2.5.6 that the Forecast Figures for Gas Year 2024/2025 are to be adjusted as follows:

The effect of this notice is that, as provided for by Condition 2A.2.5.6, the PSA is to recalculate the Forecast Postalised Charges for Gas Year 2024/2025 from 1st April 2025 with the purpose of aligning back to the original forecast revenue.
