## NOTICE UNDER ARTICLE 10 OF THE ELECTRICITY (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER 1992

The Northern Ireland Authority for Utility Regulation ("the Authority") hereby gives notice as follows:

- 1) The Authority, in accordance with Article 10(1)(c) of the Electricity (Northern Ireland) Order 1992 ("the Order"), has granted a licence to supply electricity (the "Licence") to ElectroRoute Energy Supply NI Limited (the "Licensee").
- 2) The premises to be supplied are set out in Schedule 1 of the Licence.
- 3) On 27 September 2016, the Authority published a notice<sup>1</sup>, under Article 10(4) of the Order, of its intention to grant the licence. The Authority asked for any representations or objections with respect to the proposal to grant an electricity supply licence to be made on or before 27 October 2016. We did not receive any responses.
- 4) The consolidated licence is also available to view on our website.
- 5) The Authority has sent a copy of this notice to the Licensee, the Department for the Economy and the Consumer Council for Northern Ireland.
