## Chair Clive Elphick Group Policy Director United Utilities plc

Clive is Group Policy Director of United Utilities pic and a Director of United Utilities Water pic. Clive is also a non-executive director of the Department for Culture, Media and Sport and chairs the Department's audit committee. He was recently appointed a member of Defra's Strategy Group. In 1991 he joined North West Water as Group Financial Controller, and was subsequently appointed as the company's Economic Regulation Director to lead the 1994 periodic review of prices. He was then Group Strategic Planning Director of United Utilities and then a Chief Operating Officer of the regulated business.

He joined ICI in 1981 as a management scientist and qualified as an accountant while working for the company. In 1986 he joined Deloitte & Touche as a management consultant, where he led a variety of business planning assignments for public and private sector organisations. Then in 1990 he was seconded to the Office of Water Services (Ofwat) as it's first Head of Regulatory Accounting. Clive Elphick has a degree in Natural Sciences from Queens' College, Cambridge and a doctorate in Operational Research from Birmingham University. Clive is married to Jane and his interests include hiking, skiing, mountain biking and classical music.



# Conor Murphy MP\_\_\_Minister for Regional Development\_\_\_Northern Ireland

Conor Murphy was appointed Minister for Regional Development (DRD) on 8 May 2007

He was educated at St. Colmans College and studied at both University of Ulster and Queens University Belfast.

Conor first entered politics in 1989 as a member of Newry and Mourne District Council. Elected as Assembly member for Newry/Armagh in 1998 Conor served as Party Spokesperson on Equality, was Party Whip and Chair of the Procedures Committee and Deputy Chair of the Public Accounts Committee.

He was re-elected to the Assembly in 2003 and elected as MP for Newry/Armagh in 2005. Conor is a senior member of the Sinn Féin negotiating team. Since his successful re-election to the Assembly in March 2007 Conor was nominated by Sinn Féin to the executive ministerial portfolio of Recional Development.



# Jo Aston\_\_\_Director of Water Regulation \_\_\_Northern Ireland Utility Regulator

As a Chartered Civil Engineer, Jo has worked for both the private and public sector, predominantly in the Water Industry. Her experience spans all aspects of the business, from managing a team of professional designers to directing a large operational workforce. She oversaw the construction of Water Service's first Public Private Partnership, before moving into Asset Management. She was the Project Manager of Water Service's second Asset Management Plan which defined a £3billion investment requirement over a 20 year horizon. Before leaving the Water Service to join the Regulator's office in May 2007, she was instrumental in the development of the Asset Management Model for the new company Northern Ireland Water. Jo is now responsible for establishing the economic regulatory regime for the new government owned Water Company, Northern Ireland Water sole provider of water and sewerage services for the province. Jo has in the past been a very active member of the Institution of Civil Engineers, but currently energies are diverted to the taxi service which comes with three active children.



# Dave Foster\_\_\_Head of Water Management \_\_\_NI Environment Agency

Dave is Head of Water Management for the Northern Ireland Environment Agency. In this role he leads a team of 240 policy, operational and laboratory staff, whose overall aim is the protection and improvement of the Northern Ireland's aquatic environment. The Unit's work involves responding to pollution incidents, monitoring the chemical and biological quality of the aquatic environment, regulation of discharges (both point and diffuse source), pollution prevention advice and education, and the development and implementation of river basin management plans. Previously Dave worked for the Environment Agency for England & Wales in a variety of operational and policy roles in relation to the water environment. From 2000 to 2002 he led the project team set up by the Environment Agency to implement the EU Water Framework Directive. He has a degree in Biological Sciences and an MSc in Natural Resources Management.



# Eleanor Gill\_\_Chief Executive\_\_Northern Ireland

Eleanor's career began in the private sector before joining the public sector within health and social services. Prior to taking up her post as Chief Executive at the Consumer Council, Eleanor spent four years as leader of the Armagh and Dungannon Health Action Zone. Here, she was responsible for delivering improvements in public health by engaging the community, public and private sectors to work in partnership.

Eleanor has a strong track record in management and leadership with a particular focus on policy and strategy development and planning, information management and technology.

Eleanor has been appointed as Visiting Professor in the Faculty of Business and Management School of Hotel, Leisure and Tourism at the University of Ulster at Jordanstown. She was the first recipient of the Public Sector Personality of the Year at the UTV/Ulster Business Awards in 2007. Eleanor was chosen because of her significant contribution to the public sector which impacts on and contributes to the business and economic sectors.
